During the mid morning break, each child is provided with nourishing snacks. The children are thriving and show immense enthusiasm for learning. It is a joy to see their progress.

Plans – Extension

We are keen to broaden the activities of Nirban Math and make it a vibrant part of the community. A second storey is being constructed with a view to house vocational training facilities for some young men and women of the neighboring villages. Such training will include sewing, knitting and the making of simple items such as candles and Agarbatti. This should all come to fruition by September 2010.

The second storey is also intended to provide food and lodging to 2-4 meritorious pupils from the nearby area. These children will be selected from amongst the scheduled tribes.

The main hall in the second storey is to be known as "Asoke Hall". It will have a number of uses and will be dedicated to Sri Asoke Sen, a devotee who passed away on 1st March 2007. He spent many happy days of his youth with his family at Santi Ashram and the Math.
