

NIRBAN MATH TRUST NEWSLETTER – October 2020 KOR CHI

HAPPY PUJAS from Golders Green.

Hope everyone is safe and well.

This has been an important year for the Math, and it has been wonderful to see increased energy and engagement from family members. As many of you are already aware, a number of new ideas have been proposed regarding the governance and work of the Math and it is very much hoped that this momentum will continue. On the other end of the spectrum, local restrictions resulting from Covid-19 have raised challenges to the Math's work. Nevertheless, it has been gratifying to see how family members have stepped up to support the Math's local community during this difficult time and there is plenty of work that the Math can continue to do. Thakuma's birthday celebrations (Utsab) was held on 6th March 2020. On this occasion, there were some family members from the USA to give it a special flavour. The visitors included Anjana (Anju), Surajit (Sunu) & Jayati. From Kolkata, we had Nandita, Rahul (Bhuttu) and ever present Kutti accompanied by Tarun.

It would be wonderful if others took the opportunity to grace the occasion next March, always assuming Covid has been neutralized.

Earlier in the year, **Saraswathi Puja** was celebrated with the usual gusto of the children of Balkendra, but it was just before the school had to shut down due to government restrictions. Independence Day this year was a low-key affair and limited to hosting the flag only. It was attended by Subrata, our staff and teachers.

The school is now shut down due to Covid-19. Education nevertheless remains an important part of the Math's work and there are plans to reopen the school in accordance with government guidelines at the appropriate time. In the meantime, we are working on how best to progress the educational activities of the Math.

In February, Subrata Roy, our Deoghar Trustee, introduced to us a local volunteer organization – Inner Wheel. They are involved in numerous activities related to childrens' education. A team of 7 – 8 people of theirs visited the Math and have in principle agreed to get involved in the supervision and general running of Balkendra. Subsequently, during the Utsav, they also met with two of our family's Montessori Directresses (Anju and Jayati). As a result, we all have a better understanding of the needs of the local community and a way forward.

A sub-committee has been formed to oversee the running of Balkendra. It is being headed by Anju and assisted by Ratna, Nandita and Devina. Work has started and Anjana has already presented a Vision statement and a comprehensive Operations Guide to the Trustees. It will be distributed to all shortly.

Computer Classes

These too had to be shut down due to Covid. Anjana has agreed to include the Computer classes into the Balkendra framework. The basic objective is to impart critical life skills to these children.

Tailoring Classes

We have received a donation to purchase up to 10 machines and some fabric, with a view to setting up classes for some of the local women. This too would come under the purview of Balkendra. The Trustees have agreed that it would be prudent to invite one of the local organisations like Inner Wheel or Needs to supervise the running of the classes.

Purulia

We have been successful in stopping further encroachment into our property. Our lawyers from Kolkata are guiding our solicitor in Purulia

We now have a High Court Order directing the local constabulary to ensure that the Injunction is not interfered with.

A Commissioner of the Purulia District Court attended the premises and made notes of the damage and full extent of the trespass. The Commissioners Report has been filed at the Court and the Court has directed the presence of both parties to be present on the date of the next hearing on 19th November 2020 at which time we are hoping to get a permanent injunction with instructions to the local constabulary and state officials to ensure it is enforced.

In the meantime, the Kolkata High Court has adjourned the hearing till 23rd Nov'20. Basically, the intention here is to reinforce the order of Purulia High court - the Commissioners report should help.

Covid 19

One of the most rewarding activities done by the Math during this period of immense difficulty has been the distribution of food packets to approximately 800 families. These include food packets distributed:

- to the families of our school children
- to families in the Purulia region on 2 occasions
- to families in Subrata Roy's local area
- to Ramakrishna Mission children
- to other local families via Inner Wheel

All this was possible due to the generosity of our members spread round the globe. Since the hardship continues, we are planning to do another round of distribution in the near future. Likely cost will be about \$2500.

Growth of the Math

Following an email earlier in the year to all from Anju about the administration of the Math, Gen Next has started to get involved in the activities and running of the Math.

With this, a new vigour has been injected and fresh ideas forthcoming to grow and sustain the Math. In particular:

• As mentioned above, in Feb' 20, the Math was introduced to the local chapter of global volunteer а association known as Inner Wheel. Inner Wheel has in principle agreed to provide supervision to ensure the smooth running of Balkendra. They also agreed in principle to support other charitable activities that the Math may wish to undertake. The next step will be to agree exactly what support/ management supervision Inner Wheel will provide to the Math and the basis of this. Covid-19 has delayed this activity but the Trustees are keen to progress it further.

- Anju, Deepon and Sunu have now been inducted into the Board of Trustees.
- Rahul (Bhuttu) will also be overseeing the repairs & building work, the first phase of which relates to the Balkendra. He will coordinate with Anju, Sunu and Subrata as required to expedite the work. The attached schedule lists the first phase of repairs / building work that are scheduled to be carried out.
- Avijit has become our financial internal auditor
- Rishi (Bhuttu's son), with the assistance of Sunu, has set up a new website. Even though still a work in progress, it now has the most comprehensive information on Thakuma and Nirban Math in one place. - Rahul & Rita have arranged for all existing Thakuma's books in print to be digitally scanned and translated. All the scanned books can be seen through the website.
- In the interest of open communication between the Board and all devotees of Thakuma, we will start quarterly information exchange meetings using the Google Meet platform. The 1st quarterly meet is scheduled for Saturday, <u>November 7 @9:30am</u> <u>Houston time</u>. A meeting invite will be sent to all but in case such does not arrive, please put this meeting on your
