

# NIRBAN MATH TRUST NEWSLETTER – Year End 2021



#### **GREETINGS AND BEST WISHES TO ALL.**

With Thakuma's blessings, we hope that everyone stayed well, and that all of you were able to enjoy continued progress and success in your personal and professional lives. Here's a photo collage of recent blooms in Deoghar to warm your hearts.



2021 was a tough year because of Covid but it gave us time to take care of much needed repairs and upgrades to campus facilities, look at the financial health of the Trust and generally think & plan for the future. While Balkendra remained closed, the pandemic gave the Trust opportunities to increase its humanitarian efforts. The general activities of the Math in terms of pujas, bhogs etc also continued unabated. It has been really gratifying to see how family members have stepped up to provide increased financial support to the Trust in order to get the repairs done and do effective

humanitarian outreach during this time. Following is a summary of the year that was.

#### **Repairs**

Long due repairs and upgrades were completed at both Shanti Ashram and Nirban Math. This was the major focus of work in 2021.

**Shanti Ashram** saw major structural upgrades in the following areas:

- new structural support to the first floor ceiling to avoid imminent collapse
- new roof over the east side portico; the old roof was rotted and could have fallen at any time
- Jal Chaad to ensure that water drains out properly from the chaad
- repairs to the south side portico to correct for significant water leakage from the roof

#### In addition to the above:

- new ceiling and vent fans were installed in the big classroom to increase air circulation during summer months
- computers were all upgraded to latest Windows and memory added to increase speed
- a new drinking and hand wash station was installed with a new water purifier
- all the student bathrooms were fixed up with proper fittings and doors; in particular a special bathroom was created for girls only
- all student desks were covered with fresh lamination

**Nirban Math** also saw major repairs & upgrades as listed below:

new Jal Chaad on the two story building

- new outdoor kitchen facilities for major celebrations
- needed repairs to the staff bathrooms
- new detached guest bathroom with western toilet
- new geysers in the main building
- new platform for future generator installation
- new underground reservoir to capture corporation water
- new roof mounted water tank to provide better water supply to Shanti Ashram
- weather protected power outlets distributed around the campus with underground wiring

#### **General Repairs:**

Aside from the specific work done on the main structures, we also did the following:

- put in new security barbed wire around the whole perimeter
- did general cleanup of dead trees and debris such as bricks, sand, stone chips etc that had collected over the years; some these were re-utilized in the repairs
- also cleaned up overgrown vegetation on rail side of the perimeter wall
- put in steel mesh covers on the wells to prevent falling branches and leafs
- beautification of the grounds around the new Mandir

Of interest to note is that much of the materials required for the Nirban Math repairs - such as bricks, stone chips etc - were reclaimed from the grounds itself.

#### Phase 2 repairs:

There are still more repairs to be done which we are calling Phase 2. The main focus in Phase 2 will be the repairs to all the Nirban Math buildings. During these repairs we hope to:

- correct long standing structural defects
- fix water leakage issues
- fix broken windows & doors
- freshen up the buildings with new plaster and paint
- anything else that comes up during inspections

We plan to complete the Phase 2 repairs in 2022. We are now evaluating quotes for the most critical of these repairs. These overall repairs are likely to be of the same scale and cost as the Phase 1 repairs since there are 6 buildings to be fixed up.

#### **Humanitarian Works**

The covid situation forced us to take up some humanitarian works and attend to staff welfare as listed below:

- we did 4 rounds of dry provisions/food packets distribution; most of these food distributions were supported from general funds but atleast one sponsored by a donor
- we provided 1.5 lacs direct monetary assistance in response to the Oxygen Emergency

- Noticing that many kids came to the Math in bare feet, we provided keds for all the Balkendra kids. Help from Kunal Biswas is gratefully acknowledged in organizing the keds distribution
- Blankets for Balkendra families were provided by the largesse of Sanjukta Sen and family
- Jackets for the school staff and sweaters for ground staff were provided as staff welfare and in recognition of their dedication during these tough times.
   Debdatta managed the procurement of the blankets, jackets and sweaters from vendors in Calcutta.

#### **Sewing Classes**

We have received a donation to purchase machines and materials to set up sewing classes for some of the local women. A local teacher, who is known to the family, was contacted by Subrata Roy, and has agreed to conduct the classes. About 30 ladies have signed up for classes - they were interviewed by the Instructor for the starting level of skills. The organization of the classes has been done on paper but the classes have not started yet.

#### **Eye Camp**

We also received a donation to organize one eye camp, where the locals will be given an eye check up and a pair of eyeglasses if needed. Subrata Roy and Dipankar Duttagupta are coordinating the effort; it will be done as soon as conditions are amenable for such a camp.

#### **General Math Activities**

Inspite of the difficult situation caused by Covid, there was plenty of work that the Math continued to do. A monthly list of the activities performed by the Math staff is given in **Appendix 1**. In general the Math activities consisted of:

- daily pujas
- special pujas
- special events
- campus upkeep
- handling of petty cash

#### **Balkendra**

Due to covid, the Balkendra school remained closed through the year. However, It was an opportunity to consider all aspects of Balkendra operations for possible enhancements. So taking advantage of this down time, Anjana Choudhuri has worked with the school staff to enhance:

- Teaching methods
- Curriculum
- Physical environment and
- Classroom Management

The primary motivation for the suggested changes were comments from the teachers themselves that the school had to be more engaging to hold the interest of students and to ensure maximum participation. Details of all the new curricular elements, which were

actually developed by the Teachers themselves are provided in **Appendix 2**.

### **Development of the Math**

To guide future development of the Math, Anjana Choudhuri has prepared a white paper listing all possible endeavors with their attendant requirements in terms of resources, materials and logistics. After careful review of the list it became obvious that a local coordinator/overseer is needed in order to effectively manage/coordinate/sustain activity beyond those currently being done. The overseer should be relatively computer with familiarity with savvv email communication and standard office tools. So the development planning has taken a back seat to finding a proper local overseer.

A partial list of activities performed by the ground staff is provided below as Appendix 3. This list was prepared by the Ground staff themselves, at the urging of Anjana Choudhuri, with a view towards developing a comprehensive operations manual for the campus.

In addition to the permanent staff, we also have 5 teachers who have been kept on the payroll through the covid situation. At this time, they help with food and other distribution activities in the Math, in addition to working with Anjana Choudhuri on school set up and preparation.

As you can see from the above description, operation of Nirban Math is a pretty complex affair - the management of the staff and hiring of additional day laborers is handled by Debdatta Biswas.

#### **Purulia**

We have obtained some court injunctions but not been successful in stopping encroachment into the Maguria property. Our lawyers from Kolkata are guiding a solicitor in Purulia. However, other than a mutually amicable settlement, it may be difficult to stop further encroachment.

#### **General Communication with Members**

Many have raised their heads to help/guide/question Math's development and management. All comments/suggestions/ideas are welcome. To maintain open communication and transparency in the affairs of the Trust, a quarterly virtual meeting has been set up. We encourage all to attend these meetings. In addition to the quarterly virtual meetings, the

'NMT Path Forward' whatsapp group has been created for immediate transmission of important news. Hope you see all these as positive developments and get encouraged to provide more active support.

#### Volunteering

We ardently hope that some of you, especially the next Gen, will take the opportunity to visit our Math, when it is finally safe to do so or to in the meantime volunteer in some capacity.

We thank all the members and well-wishers for their generous donations and support. We continue to seek your blessings, well wishes, feedback, suggestions and your donations.



#### **Appendix 2: Balkendra Development**

Following are some of the enhancements that will be adopted for Balkendra once the school reopens.

#### **Teaching Method:**

It was agreed that learning for all ages is best when learning is concrete and experiential - a touch, feel, see and MAKE experience ... especially so in the case of Balkendra aged children ....

The suggested teaching method is based on the innate process of learning for children of their age:

"... Help me to do it by myself", "...help me to think for myself"

Concrete experiential learning would supplement the traditional method in use, to enforce student' engagement and interest.

To provide the needed concrete experiences, teachers spent much of the year in discussions, preparing concrete materials and models, per subject and topic, for class presentations and student construction. Examples of the materials and models created by the teachers are given below.

Not provided here is A Framework illustrating how Phases of this method could be used for remote learning.

#### **Curriculum:**

Curriculum remains the same as such but some science elements will be introduced with hands-on experiments to build interest, engagement, understanding and the desire to learn and know more.

#### Classroom arrangement:

Classroom arrangements have been reconsidered with individual work areas to permit unsupervised activities. Classroom spaces have also been rethought to accommodate covid restrictions.

#### Storage:

Storage areas with new shelving have been created to provide adequate accommodation for materials and supplies.

#### **Physical Environment:**

Recent repairs and upgrades to furniture and Shanti Ashram are for purposes of safety and to mitigate classroom conditions during the heat of summer.

In the future, after Balkendra returns to normal operation, Cameras can be considered for installation in the classrooms to permit remote monitoring.

#### Balkendra Forms and Policies:

Standardized forms related to student Registration Cards, teacher profiles, teacher responsibilities, Annual Calendar format, and other aspects have been developed. Master copies of these forms are kept on one of the Balkendra PCs.

Unfortunately, Covid restrictions have not permitted us to introduce these new practices. Our appreciation to Teachers for their cooperation and excitement with all new ideas and additions.

Enormous thanks to Amit Mitra, our overall custodian at the site, for his help at every turn related to Balkendra, Nirban Math, and other aspects of the upkeep of the whole campus.

Together, Amit Mitra and the teachers are a happy, hard working band! They are the machines that make things work. They wait for things to return to normal.




#### Examples of Materials prepared by the Teachers for Math demonstrations.









Examples of Materials prepared by the Teachers for Science demonstrations.











Similar Materials were created for Language demonstrations
